Integrity - building trust between partners



Connecting Europe - non-stop on the rails

The Shuttle Net connects the major economic areas of Europe – from Scandinavia to southern Italy, from Spain to Russia, from Benelux to Romania. The shuttle trains carry all common loading units such as containers, tank containers, swap bodies and semi-trailers with intermodal equipment: fast, safe, eco-friendly, and year round.

New markets - from Europe to the Far East

Together with its partners, Hupac has established a performing network for shipments to Russia and the Far East. Via the Gadki hub, close to Poznan, we offer numerous destinations in the emerging markets of Russia, China and Korea.

Megatrailers - crossing the Alps by train

Modern, P400 codified semi-trailers can already cross the Alps by train. The Hupac network comprises around 100 shuttle trains per week on the 4-meter-corridors via Lötschberg and Brenner, connecting the main economic areas north and south of the Alps.

Full service - flexible and dependable

Our customers book and deliver the goods – we do the rest: from train scheduling to capacity management, from traffic control to event management around the clock. Our proactive teams provide reliable updates on any disruptions and take action to maintain the services.

IT systems - strategic factor

With innovative systems to track shipments and exchange data we offer our customers a vital service to control the logistics and ensure fast and easy processes.

Dangerous goods - in capable hands

Together with our customers we define the components and the level of our Company Shuttle services based on different configuration options. For example, the package may comprise the following items:


- ▶ wagon rental

Order management - perfectly integrated

Orders must be processed efficiently. We install a customised order-to-billing system for each train with effective IT integration between the customer's ERP software and Hupac's operating system.

From purchasing railway services and operational control of the day-to-day business to taking action in case of disruption and wagon management, we act as an interface to the railways and free up our customers to allow them to focus on their core business.



Terminals Efficient interface between road and rail

Specialists for the road-to-rail transfer

Hupac operates nine terminals for the road-to-rail transfer of intermodal loading units. The largest facilities are located in Busto Arsizio-Gallarate, Singen and Antwerp. There are also terminals in Aarau, Basel, Chiasso and Piacenza: small but very efficient terminals offering excellent, high-quality services.

With regard to the opening of the Gotthard base tunnel, Hupac is developing new terminal capacities in the area of Milan together with Italian partners.

Busto Arsizio-Gallarate terminal Busto Arsizio-Gallarate is the central hub of the

Shuttle Net. Dozens of trains connect the terminal to a wide range of destinations in Switzerland, the Netherlands, Germany, Belgium, Spain, Denmark and Sweden. The facility also serves as a gateway platform for continued travel within the Italian network.

The terminal is located 20 km northwest of Milan and can be reached directly from the highway. It is equipped with four crane modules with twelve gantry cranes and is able to handle up to 30 train pairs per day.

A high-performance structure and efficient processes guarantee smooth transfers and short cycle times. The Busto Arsizio-Gallarate terminal is open six days a week around the clock. An own customs office and warehouse facilities close to the terminal integrate the offer.

Singen terminal

The Singen terminal is an efficient transhipment facility in the south of Baden-Württemberg. With daily departures to Italy and connections to maritime ports, this site is a major hub on the north-south axis.

Antwerp terminal

Antwerp is one of the main intersections in European freight transport with high volumes in maritime as well as continental traffic. The shuttle trains use the HTA Hupac Terminal Antwerp for connections on the north-south axis and the Combinant Terminal focusing mainly on east-west traffic.






















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
